Everyone, young and old, are invited to have their throat blessed after Mass on <b>February 2-3</b>.</p>
<p><b>PASTOR'S CORNER</b>          Ultimate alienation is estrangement from God, the One who loves us and gives us life. Therefore, we should always welcome His gifts of mercy and forgiveness. In today's first reading we see the exiles returning home, well actually the children of the exiles since Israel has spent some seventy years in Babylon. Listening to the reading of the Torah, or the Law of the Lord, they receive at least an inkling of the bond between themselves and God who had seemed at times far away but now was utterly real and present. They felt at home at last.</p> <p>St. Paul's analogy of the body really reminds us that we are one people also as the Church, the descendants if you like of Israel now transformed by Jesus' sacrifice. Sometimes we might fall for the idea that there are only a few essential people, the leadership for instance, with the rest contributing little or nothing to the whole. However, we are all called to be part of the body the people of God. So Paul's explanation today is as simple as it is true and we must all do our bit for the whole.</p> <p>As God loves us so we are called to love God and to show that love by our prayers and works. Jesus inaugurates his mission in today's Gospel and we must share in that mission, using the gifts of time, talent and treasure that God has given to us.
