PASTOR'S CORNER

We might be led to believe, especially when we read today's Old Testament and Gospel readings that the "call" of God must come as something strange or otherworldly and that therefore it is rare but we are all called by God – to holiness and the doing of His will. We are unworthy but God meets us where we are in life and helps us long the right path.

Isaiah was called to be a prophet, God's spokesman and so although not worthy, his lips would be purified and he was able to proclaim and be the speaking instrument of the Lord our God.

In the Gospel Peter does not seem to be much of a "rock." Disgusted at his failure to catch many fish, his lack of earthly success, he turns to Jesus for help and is more than satisfied with his catch. He is able to see beyond the fish in his net as Jesus calls him to become a fisher of men. Peter is to draw others to be part of Christ's mission. Like Isaiah and Peter, we can find ourselves unsure of the direction we should take in life – our true vocation. We must give ourselves the time we need to discern what that is – knowing that Jesus has the answer and will direct us.
